Saturday June 13, 2009 – During the Saddle Horse Show



Do you have a Pinto horse or pony?

A Pinto horse must have four square inches of cumulative white in the qualifying zone and underlying pink skin. The requirement is modified with the size of the equine requiring only three square inches for ponies and two square inches for miniatures. Horses that meet the eligibility requirements for registration as a Pinto can be registered at any time or age.

Do you want to try showing with the Ontario Pinto Horse Association (OPtHA)?

The OPtHA is offering classes at the 2009 Caledon Fair. If your horse or pony qualifies as a Pinto but is not registered with the PtHA you can still participate for the day. Points earned on fair day count towards Ontario Pinto Horse Association club points only (not PtHA points). Pinto points earned during the Caledon Fair will be eligible towards OPtHA Club points for 2009 if you are a current member of the OPtHA or if you join the OPtHA prior to their next recognized show in 2009.

Which Pinto classes am I eligible to enter?

Youth classes – eligible exhibitors are 18 years of age or younger as of January 1st of current year.
Amateur classes – eligible exhibitors are 19 years of age or older and are not equine professionals.
Open classes – all ages and levels of exhibitors are eligible to compete in open classes.
