

Horse Show Rules

1. The term horses pertains to any horse, pony, mule or donkey exhibited at the Fair.
2. The Committees reserve the right to postpone any show if, for any reason, they deem it advisable, or to alter condition or refuse entries.
3. No interference or complaints to judges by any exhibitor will be tolerated. Any protest must be made in writing and in the hands of the Secretary within 24 hours after the Fair and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$25.00 which shall be forfeited to the Society if the protest is not sustained. The judgement of the show committee shall be final.
4. All riders and attendants (exhibitors, coaches, parents, etc.) must have signed a waiver prior to riding or driving any horse on the Caledon Fairgrounds.
5. All riders and attendants (exhibitors, coaches, parents, etc.) must be neatly and suitably dressed for their chosen equestrian discipline.
6. All riders and drivers of horses at Caledon Fair must wear an approved riding helmet meeting SEI/ASTM standards for equestrian safety while mounted anywhere on Caledon Fairgrounds (show ring, warm-up ring, trailer area, etc.)
7. All riders must wear proper footwear for equestrian riding with a heel of no less than 1.5 centimetres at all times while mounted on any horse on Caledon Fairgrounds property.
8. Each horse and rider/driver combination will be assigned an entry number which must be worn in the show ring. Proper entry numbers must be clearly visible when being judged.
9. Classes are open to all breeds, horses, and ponies, unless otherwise specified for that show or class. Ponies and horses may be measured if applicable.
10. Exhibitors must pay admission in lieu of an exhibitors fee.
11. In all classes, the safety of the horse and rider shall be the first consideration.
12. All dogs must be leashed while on the Caledon Fairgrounds.
13. Exhibitors are requested to make their entries early.
14. Exhibitors not ready for judging at the proper time will forfeit any right of competition.
15. Persons crossing the horse show rings do so at their own risk.
16. All horses are restricted to the trailer parking area, designated warm-up areas or show rings, and may not be taken into pedestrian access areas, near the food booth (s), or any other area of the fair not designated for horses. Riding or driving of horses outside of designated show rings or warm-up rings at gait faster than a walk is strictly prohibited.
17. Entry fees will be refunded only if requested prior to the start of that class.
18. Refer to the specific rules for each horse show held at the Caledon Fair as printed on their respective pages of the Caledon Fall Fair Prize Book of the current year. Additionally, please refer to any association rulebooks as specified to be in effect for each horse show.
19. The Rules of the Canadian Equestrian Federation apply to the Welsh Pony Show.
20. The Rules of the Ontario Combined Driving Association apply to the Open Driving Show.
21. WHAO Rules apply to the Saddle Horse Show, unless otherwise specified.
